Beyond his Law degree from the University of Bucharest, Raul's interests revolve around environmental journalism and communications, enhancing topics surrounding the politics of climate change and food security. Raul holds two Master's Degrees in political science and development from the Central European University Budapest and University of Trento, Italy. He collaborated with the World Wildlife Fund – Danube Carpathian Program, founded the Slow Food Bucharest chapter and acted as an environmental law consultant in Brussels. Between 2009 and 2010 he was International Grassroots Outreach Fellow at Earth Day Network in Washington, D.C. Michele Dalla Palma



Michele Dalla Palma is a professional alpine skier, ski instructor for National FIS, mountaineering and ski touring instructor for CAI and one of the founders of Survival in Italy. In the end-70s he devoted himself to mountaineering and climbing and organized numerous expeditions around the world, from the Himalayas to the Andes, from African deserts to Patagonia and Tierra del Fuego. He participated at the first Italian ascent to Makalu (8481 m) in 1984. In 1987 he completed the crossing of Suguta Valley, 370 km on foot in self-sufficiency in the Great African Rift between Kenya and Ethiopia; in 2002 he participated in the "Overland 6", making 36.000 km through Europe, Asia and Africa during which he climbed the highest peaks of the twenty countries. In the winter 2005 he traveled 15.000 km in the Far East Russia from Vladivostok to Irkutsk. As a journalist and photographer he produced hundreds of reports on every continent; he is Managing Editor of the magazine Trekking & Outdoor and a known photographer whose photos have been exhibited in most major Italian cities. He produced numerous documentaries and TV reportages, including: "Siberia, la terra addormentata"; "Alaska, ultima frontiera"; "Dancalia, la Terra del Diavolo", "Nella preistoria coi Surma", "Sulle tracce degli Incas". His broadcast "Sentieri d'Italia", with more than 100 episodes are dedicated to discovering Italy on foot.

Roberto Di Caro




